Some articles featuring barndoors.

I've got the bad habit to keep everything but there is a moment when it takes you hours to find that precise article or that precise picture (even if you know in what magazine it is...). So I came up with the idea of building a kind of summary of what I have in stock. Here are some of the magazines I have.

It's just a start as I think you could delve into your stacks of magazines and DO THE SAME over longer periods or with magazines I don't have.

When "article" is not written, only a picture can be seen. But it's important for a registrar: precise type, colour, registration, options can then often be seen...
